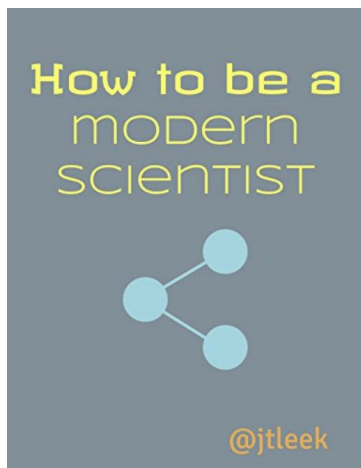

2019 RFP: Community Voting Results

33 statements of interest submitted

51 comments or questions on our discussion site

140 ballots returned (14%)

- First, we haven't had a monthly meeting since the results of our Community Voting for our annual proposals process.
- My main message is that I want to thank the community for giving us your time - for statement of interest submissions, listening to the lightning talks, engaging in Q&A, and finally for voting and supporting ideas that you think the CDI should support.
- We had 33 statements of interest submitted, 51 comments or questions on our discussion site, and 140 ballots returned, which was a 14% voter turnout rate.

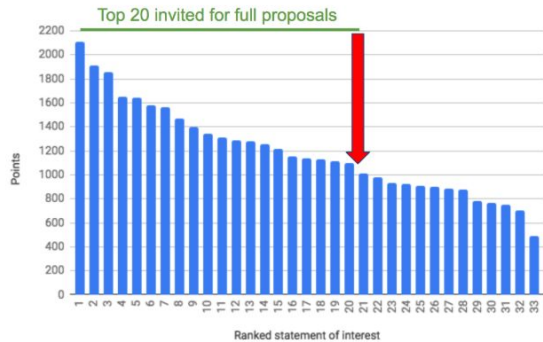

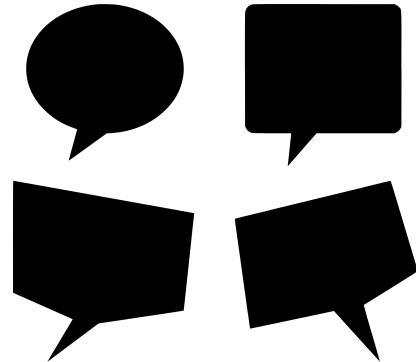
- And here I'd just like to show the Lead PIs whose statements of interest have advanced to full proposal phase.
