


# Data Management WG, 7/11: USGS Data Release Workbench, ScienceBase and Science Data Catalog differences, Data Sharing Agreements

Components of the Data Release Workbench.

Differences between USGS Science Data Catalog and ScienceBase are nicely illustrated in this table:

Science Data Catalog	ScienceBase
<p>Metadata only</p> <p>Search and discovery tool that allows for metadata retrieval, visualization, download, and linking back to original data providers</p> <p><a href="http://data.usgs.gov/datacatalog/">http://data.usgs.gov/datacatalog/</a></p>	<p>Upload data, metadata, create <u>websites</u>, and create communities</p> <p><a href="https://www.sciencebase.gov/about/content/about-sciencebase">https://www.sciencebase.gov/about/content/about-sciencebase</a></p>
<p>Single source for USGS to serve its metadata to data.doi.gov, Data.gov, Office of Management and Budget (OMB), etc.</p>	
<p><u>Required</u> for data release (metadata record must be submitted to the SDC)</p>	<p><u>Option</u> for scientists/Centers/Programs to release data in USGS</p>

JC Nelson has been working on drafting **Data Sharing Agreements at USGS to guide centers/programs when they are working with collaborators/funders**.
